

FBI Data Documentation: January–June 2025 & 2026 Extract

Welcome to the California Crime Data Dashboard. This project is a collaboration between the [Committee on Revision of the Penal Code](#) and the [California Policy Lab](#).

This documentation provides information on our data sources, guidance on exploring the dashboard, data coverage details, and a data dictionary to help you interpret the metrics.

Data Source

The Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) provides monthly, agency-level summarized crime data across the United States. The California Policy Lab compiled these data for law enforcement agencies in California that reported to the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program for all months in the specified time period. The data is obtained by querying the [FBI's Crime Data API](#).

The FBI data extract described below was published on August 15, 2026, incorporating a 1.5-month lag to account for reporting delays and allow for greater data stability. All population counts are based on 2025 FBI population estimates.

Supplemental Public Data: To ensure the dashboards remain representative of crime in California, supplemental public data was manually sourced and integrated for the three of the largest agencies that had incomplete FBI data:

- [Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department \(LASD\)](#) - 2025 FBI Population: 945,223
- [San Francisco Police Department \(SFPD\)](#) - 2025 FBI Population: 815,330
- [Oakland Police Department \(OPD\)](#) - 2025 FBI Population: 444,211
 - *Note: OPD public data excludes the final few days of June for both 2025 and 2026.*

Data coverage

The Jan-June 2026 dashboard includes a total of **683 agencies** covering **91.6%** of the California population (36.1 million people), based on 2025 population estimates.

867 agencies were available for extraction in the FBI API. **680** of these agencies reported for all months in the first half of 2025 and 2026 (January–June).

16* out of **97** large agencies (agencies serving populations of 100,000 or more) did not provide complete data to the FBI for this period and are excluded from the statewide and agency-level tables.

*Excluded agencies: Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office**, San Francisco Police Department**, Long Beach Police Department, Oakland Police Department**, San Bernardino County Sheriff's Office, Santa Clarita Police Department, Huntington Beach Police Department, Ontario Police Department, Rancho Cucamonga Police Department, Lancaster Police Department, Palmdale Police Department, Victorville Police Department, Orange Police Department, Stanislaus County Sheriff's Office, Rialto Police Department, and Hesperia Police Department

***Supplemental public data from these three agencies were incorporated.*

Methodology

CHP Data Aggregation: The underlying FBI data includes 148 distinct California Highway Patrol (CHP) agencies, which consists of many specialized units such as Auto Theft Task Forces, Commercial Vehicle Enforcement, Investigative Services, and Protective Services. To maintain meaningful agency-level metrics, CHP agencies were rolled up into 52 county-level agencies using the county assignments designated by the FBI.

Reporting Thresholds: Agencies are included in the agency-level dashboard view only if they report at least 15 violent offenses or 50 property offenses in either time period. This threshold suppresses extreme percentage change fluctuations that may result from small baseline values. However, data from agencies below the threshold are included in the statewide summary statistics and remain available to view in the downloadable data file.

Data extract for download

The downloadable data file includes the raw monthly summarized reported crime data for all **867** agencies that reported to the FBI from January 2025 through June 2026, including those with incomplete reporting. This extract does not include supplemental public data and does not reflect any additions or modifications as described in the methodology section above.
